Lineup for the 2016 "Edo-Tokyo-Museum Variety Show" (Tentative Schedule)

Obon (Summer) Variety Show

Dates: August 8th (Holiday Monday.) – 12th (Fri.), and weekends between July 9th and August 28th.

Program: Traditional Japanese music, *rakugo*, and *daikagura* performances, and ghost story telling added to late afternoon shows on Saturdays.





Autumn Leaves (Autumn) Variety Show

Dates: Weekends and Holidays between September 24th and November 6th

Program: Traditional Japanese music, *rakugo*, and *daikagura* performances that are suitable to the "autumn season of art."





Traditional Performing Arts Week

Dates: Weekdays of the second and third week in November

Program: We carry it out as a workshop for elementary school children. We also hold an audience participation type of performance for the Japanese traditional musical instruments and *rakugo*.







New Year's Variety Show

Dates: January 2nd (Holiday Monday) – 4th (Wed), 7th (Sat.) – 9th (Holiday Monday)

Program: Demonstration of traditional Japanese automaton, lion dance, top-spinning, and *koto* (Japanese zither) performance of New Year's music pieces.





Family's Variety Show

Dates: March 18th (Sat.) –28th (Sun.)

Program: Family entertainment programs, juggling, *rakugo*, Japanese music, and other traditional performing arts.





Public entertainment comical Japanese dance of Edo "Kappore"

Dates: June 11th (Sat), September 10th (Sat), November 12th (Sat), December 10th (Sat), January 14th (Sat), February 11th (Sat), March 11th (Sat)

Program: Kappore is the dance that was popular among the common people in the Meiji era from the late Edo period.
